

Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III Reporting

The federal government recently authorized the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III (HEERF III) as a part of the American Rescue Plan. As a result of the HEERF III funding, Alderson Broaddus University received \$1,536,848 in funding for students. Alderson Broaddus University distributed \$1,536,856 in emergency grants to 711 students.

AB accepted applications for these funds through June 15, 2021; however, anyone who completed a HEERF II application was not required to resubmit an application for HEERF III funds if their situation had not changed. These applications were reviewed and grants were issued to students based on their information provided on the applications, and according to guidance from the federal government. Distribution of the funds began on June 25, 2021. The grants varied in amount and ranged from \$1050 to \$3556, depending on the level of need reflected with the application.

In order to be eligible to receive a HEERF III grant, AB students must:

- Have successfully completed the spring 2021 semester at Alderson Broaddus University, and have been enrolled at least part time for the 2021 spring semester as an undergraduate or graduate, degree-seeking student (Non-degree seeking enrollment will not qualify)

Eligible students may use HEERF III emergency grants for expenses related to any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus; such as tuition, technology, course materials, food, housing, health care (including mental health care), or child care.

Alderson Broaddus University received an Institutional Portion of the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III in the amount of \$1,536,848 in order to defray expenses associated with the coronavirus, carry out student support activities, or make additional financial grants to students. AB postponed drawing the Institutional Portion until after funds made available through the Student Portion had been disbursed to students.
