

# Supplemental Support under American Rescue Plan (SSARP) Reporting

The federal government recently awarded Alderson Broaddus University an additional \$213,156 in COVID-19 relief funding to be used for a combination of student and institutional needs. This grant is funded through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) and its Supplemental Support under American Rescue Plan (SSARP) program. This funding was authorized by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) signed into law December 2020. The federal application for SSARP funds indicates that the student portion of the funding must be used for eligible, degree-seeking students who are attending at least half-time in the fall 2022 semester. Eligible students may use these emergency grant funds for expenses related to any component of the **student's** cost of attendance, or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, technology, course materials, food, housing, health care (including mental health care), or child care.

In the period of September 30, 2022 to December 31, 2022, \$106,604 was issued to 712 students. These funds were disbursed in accordance to the federal regulations regarding these funds. The remaining \$106,552 institutional portion was not drawn down until all of the student portion was disbursed. The institutional portion was used to defray expenses associated with coronavirus, carrying out student support activities, or reimburse for lost revenue.
